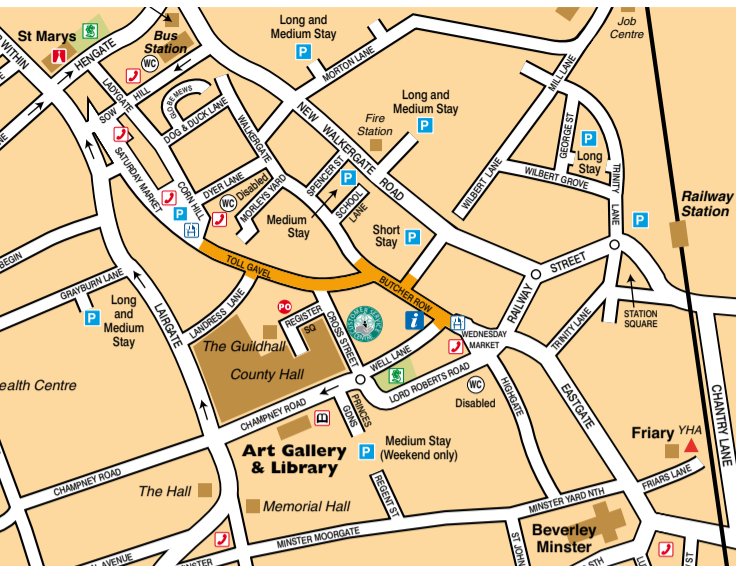


Beverley Art Gallery is situated above the Library on Champney Road, a short walk from the town centre. The entrance is through the Treasure House.

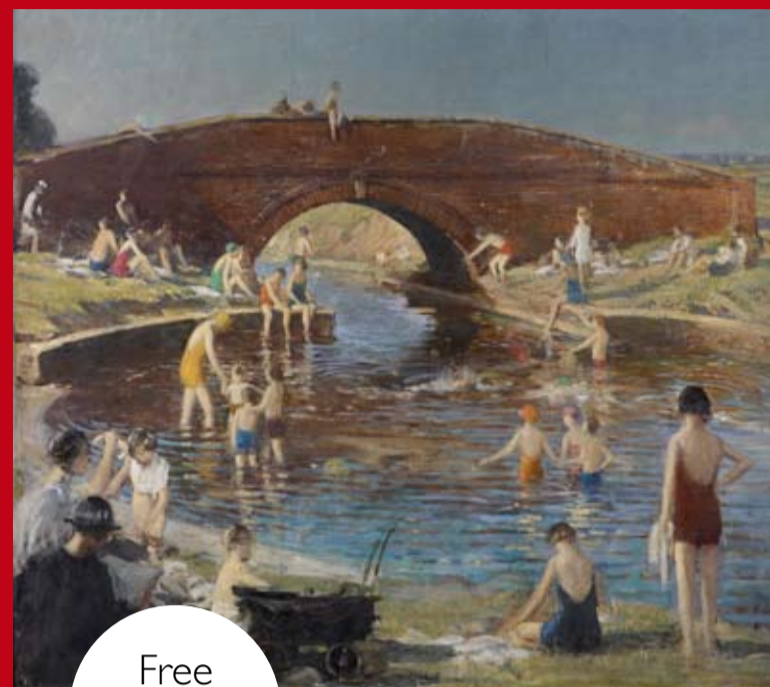

Westminster Sunset by Sir Albert Goodwin (1845-1932)

Beverley's delightful Edwardian Art Gallery is home to the 'Champney' collection featuring works by leading British artists practising in the Pre-Raphaelite mode including Arthur Hughes, Helen Allingham, Albert Goodwin and Sir William Russell Flint.

Following his death in 1958, Frederick Elwell R.A. bequeathed a considerable number of paintings (including works by his talented wife Mary) to the gallery, enabling Beverley to boast the largest single collection of works by this talented and distinguished British artist. You can also enjoy an 'outdoor exhibition' of paintings by Fred & Mary Elwell, with the *Paint the Town Fred & Mary* town trail.
